

1. Updates

Tairāwhiti Floods

Kāinga Ora teams worked together to support our customers affected by the recent floods in Tairāwhiti. Whilst no Kāinga Ora homes in Tairāwhiti had flood waters through them, some 1,145homes were affected by torrential rain.

Since Thursday, 24 March, 42 jobs have been logged for homes affected by the weather. Many of these jobs addressed significant leaks as well as drainage and electrical issues. Our trade partners were able to remedy the majority of these issues promptly despite their availability due to COVID-19. The Housing Support Team helped clean up homes that had experienced leaks. As at COB Wednesday 30 March, approximately 13 rain-related jobs remain open, many of these hampered by ongoing rain and road closures. Welfare calls were made to vulnerable customers and those in the areas most affected by the flooding. Thanks to our Auckland colleagues who supported the Tairāwhiti team to make these calls in a timely manner,

Stormwater system in Ōwairaka, Roskill Development

Auckland's recent one-in-100-year rainfall event last Monday put our new stormwater system in the Ōwairaka, Roskill Development to the test. It performed exactly as it should, resulting in minimal surface flooding, where previously flooding had been an ongoing issue. The \$32 million investment and construction over two years has resulted in a 2.8 km long new pipe network to separate waste water from storm water and prevent overflows into Te Auanga Oakley Creek, and features innovative design elements to clean the water that passes through it before it flows into the sea. Sustainability was also important to the network design, including repurposing rock that was dug up for pipe trenches (and otherwise destined for the tip) to use for sea defences, public sculptures, and backfill materials.

Stormwater upgrades are not amongst the exciting, visible infrastructure investments we're making in these neighbourhoods, but they're critical to our development programmes. It's typically only during weather events like this that the benefits can be seen.

Newly established, Te Ngāi Tūāhuriri Rūnanga (Mana Whenua) mandated skills centre

An innovative contract of service has been signed between Canterbury-based Whitiora, a newly established Te Ngāi Tūāhuriri Rūnanga (Mana Whenua) mandated skills centre and Kāinga Ora to support and assist Kāinga Ora build partners to employ job seekers into the construction sector.

The agreement will primarily focus on Māori, Pasifika, females and rangitahi as well as the Kāinga Ora customer community and aims to lead them into skills-based, future-focused, high-value opportunities.

Whitiora have created a Pou Arahi role to support the partnership which will support whānau into and in sustained work with Kāinga Ora build partners and sub-contractors. It will source candidates for these roles and provide mentoring and pastoral care for a 15 month period.

The Pou Arahi will work closely with whanau/apprentices, employers, trade teaching staff/industry training organisations. It features a unique blend of training, advisory, culture, operational and people management, leadership and facilitation skills.

Our National Commercial Build Partnership Team and the local Place-based team have worked collaboratively to create this role with our mana whenua partner – Whitiora - and are excited by the future possibilities.

Recruitment is underway to fill the role that will lead out this mahi.

Grace Street Örākei Visit

On Tuesday, 22 March, the Ōrākei Advisory Group were invited to view Kāinga Ora's newly completed homes in Grace Street, Ōrākei.

Central and East Auckland's Engagement Team have been working with Ōrākei Advisory Group since November 2020. Ōrākei Advisory Group helps inform the Ōrākei Neighbourhood Plan, which will provide Kāinga Ora a land redevelopment strategy that aims to co-ordinate our redevelopments for Ōrākei over the next 7-10 years.

The Ōrākei Advisory Group is made up of key stakeholders in the neighbourhood including Ngāti Whatua o Ōrākei, Ōrākei Local Board members, the Auckland Council Ōrākei Councillor, Ōrākei Community Association representatives, Ōrākei Primary School, St Joseph's Primary School, Catholic Diosese representatives, and representatives from the Ministry of Education and Auckland Transport.

David Everard, Deputy Chair of the Ōrākei Community Association, viewed the complex and noted "Congratulations to all those involved in the Grace Street Development, you have every right to be very proud".

Dunedin Star Block remediation works complete

Remediation works have now been completed on our two Star Block apartments in Maitland Street, Dunedin.

Built in the late 1960s, the 'star block' apartments at Maitland St are a part of social housing history in New Zealand. The style of apartment was built across the country as moves were made towards medium-density housing.

The two apartments are our only star blocks remaining in Dunedin, and the decision was made to retain the heart of the buildings through a process used elsewhere in New Zealand, but never before

in the South Island – complex remediation. In the case of Maitland Street, this has meant new roofing, cladding, insulation, double-glazing, bathroom and kitchen facilities, as well as site service upgrades.

Remediation of the first Maitland Street apartment was completed in February 2021. Work on the second block commenced in March 2021 and will be handed over in early April 2022, with many of the original residents returning to their former homes. Our customers are delighted that they will have much improved warm, dry homes for the years ahead.

Hīnaki Street apartments deliver 61 KiwiBuild homes in the Tāmaki regeneration area

Buyers will soon move in to 61 KiwiBuild homes that have been built in the new Hīnaki Street apartments, which have been developed by NZ Living. The low-rise apartment complex is part of the Hīnaki neighbourhood development in Point England, which is located within the Tāmaki regeneration area.

The Tāmaki regeneration programme is a large-scale project, delivered in partnership by Kāinga Ora and the Tāmaki Regeneration Company (TRC). Kāinga Ora provides urban development services for TRC. Collective aspirations for the large-scale project include replacing approximately 2,800 old public homes with a master planned mix of approximately 10,500 new public, affordable and market housing supply over the next 25 years.

The Hinaki Street apartments in Point England utilise walk-up typology, which is seen as pivotal in enabling the broader objectives of TRC and the Crown in the regeneration of Tāmaki.

61 out of the 75 homes in the Hinaki Street apartments have been sold to eligible KiwiBuild buyers, by direct sale. The homes are a mix of one, two and three bedrooms. The purchase price ranged from \$420,000 to \$650,000, and construction started in November 2020.

A dawn blessing, led by a local kaumātua, is expected to take place on 7 April. Buyers are expected to move into the homes from 10/11 April. Kāinga Ora is looking to collaborate with NZ Living and TRC on a proactive media piece, possibly incorporating the stories of two or three KiwiBuild buyers.
