Kāinga Ora and Oranga Tamariki Memorandum of Understanding

A new Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed by Kāinga Ora Chief Executive, Andrew McKenzie and Oranga Tamariki Chief Executive, Chappie Te Kani this month.

The MoU supports a strong partnership between our two organisations, recognising that living in warm, dry and safe homes is essential to the wellbeing of tamariki. It outlines how our organisations will become more strategically aligned, and how we can collaborate effectively on the Oranga Tamariki Action Plan. Importantly, the MOU helps us to realise one of our key priorities in the Kāinga Ora Supported Housing Strategic Plan, which is to invest and build on authentic and collaborative relationships with funder and service provider organisations. The plan, launched last year, outlines our role in the provision of publicly funded housing where the co-ordination of housing and other support services is essential to wellbeing.

Also outlined in the MOU is an undertaking to meet regularly, create shared work programmes as appropriate, and look for new initiatives that will mean we can deliver a better service. It includes a commitment to work together in respect of the Oranga Tamariki Homes Programme Agreement. The objective of the Programme is to provide Oranga Tamariki with access to a portfolio of properties that can be used to provide homes for tamariki and rangatahi in their care.

New warm and dry homes almost completed in Greymouth

Six new single-storey two-bedroom homes are almost ready for customers to move in at <u>s 9(2)(a)</u> Greymouth.

This is the first major delivery of public homes in Greymouth in several years and we have an agreement with Project High Street Limited to purchase these homes after they are completed next month. Another six single-storey two-bedroom homes on the site are still under construction and will be completed in late August.

We are pleased to be able to provide modern, warm and dry homes for people in need in a part of Greymouth that is close to town, schools, shops and other services.

Some of our older customers in Greymouth will be moving into the new homes after they are completed in July, as they are more suitable for them than the homes in which they are currently living. People on the public housing register will be matched to some of the other homes.

We are planning to hold a blessing with local iwi before customers move in. On 6 July 2023, there will be an 'open-home' for neighbours and stakeholders to walk through the development. We are also planning to issue a media release, and to invite the Greymouth Star on a tour of the homes, after this event.

Kāinga Ora developments recognised at industry awards

Four Kāinga Ora developments were awarded at the 2023 Property Industry Awards. The awards not only recognise innovative design and construction, but also assess nominees on their economic and social contribution, sustainability and vision, as well as end user satisfaction.

Our development in Martin Avenue, Leone Terrace and Margaret Avenue in Mt Albert Auckland was awarded Excellence in the Community and Affordable Housing category. In this development we replaced ten state houses with 50 new homes, which includes modern apartments and four-bedroom townhouses. Among the facilities for our customers are a playground, a solar-powered community building and smart EV chargers.

In addition, we were recognised with merit in the Community and Affordable Housing category for the following developments:

- Brewer Street in Blenheim, where 14 two-bedroom homes have been built to full universal design standard.
- Kauri Street and Kauri Place in Hastings, where 40 new public homes have replaced 11 state houses. There is a mix of one to four-bedroom duplexes and standalone homes.
- Sudeley Street in Ōrākei, Auckland where 12 new public homes have replaced two state houses.

The awards are recognition for our in-house development teams and people in the wider organisation, as well as our consultants and build partners who designed and delivered these projects for us. These partners include Peddlethorp, Bracewell Construction, Arthouse Architects, CMT Group, Young+Richards+, Penny Homes and Mike Greer.

The Property Industry Awards are run by the Property Council New Zealand and have been running for over 25 years. They are designed to showcase examples of iconic projects in property development and investment across a broad range of sectors and design disciplines, recognising outstanding projects, developments and refurbishments.

Nelson South information sessions

Earlier this month, our Nelson, Marlborough and West Coast team hosted a series of information sessions for Nelson South residents to hear more about plans to build a range of new housing in the area over the coming years.

The team held a session for Kāinga Ora customers on Tuesday, 13 June 2023, followed by two sessions for the wider Nelson South community on Wednesday, 14 and Thursday, 15 June. There was significant community interest in what's planned for the area, with around 80 people attending over the three sessions.

Kāinga Ora is proposing to replace some of its existing homes – some of which are 70 to 80 years old – across a number of sites in Nelson South to help meet an urgent need for housing in the areas.

At this stage, Kāinga Ora plans to build at least 49 new homes in Nelson South – including the recently announced 29-unit apartment development at **s9(2)(a)** – but more nomes are in the early planning and investigation stage.

As many of the plans for these new homes are still in the early stages, we will continue to keep in touch with residents as our plans progress.

Auckland LSP tour for Porirua City Council/Ngati Toa officials

Last week we hosted representatives from Porirua City Council and Ngati Toa on a tour of the Auckland LSPs. It was attended by Mayor, Anita Baker, Chief Executive, Wendy Walker, councillors and senior planning staff. Ngati Toa Chief Executive, **59(2)(a)**, and two of their senior development staff also attended.

The purpose of the tour was to share the learnings and results of developing at higher densities in existing urban areas. This also included a visit to a five-level public housing development which was completed two years ago and has been operating very successfully.

Feedback was very positive, including a better understanding of how quality community outcomes can be achieved with higher density development.

Passive House Pilot Launch and Industry Open Day

Kāinga Ora and the local community gathered in Māngere last week to celebrate the opening of Bader Ventura Passive House development.

Vui Mark Gosche, Chair of the Kāinga Ora Board addressed attendees including Chief Executive, Andrew McKenzie, Board member, Philippa Howden-Chapman, Project lead, <u>s 9(2)(a)</u> and many community stakeholders.

We followed our launch with an industry Open Day on Thursday 22 June 2023, attended by over 200 guests. Having previously shared our design and build journey and some of the early insights with industry, this Open Day was an opportunity to present our completed project. The day featured session talks from some of our project partners, including Oculus and Sustainable Engineering, Peddlethorp, 2PiR and Kirk Roberts Consulting and Precision Construction.

Not only is Bader Ventura the first Passive House development for Kāinga Ora, it is our highest ever Homestar rating (achieving both 7HS v5 and 8HS v4.1), and the first public housing Passive House development in Australasia funded by central government.

The Passive House Pilot has been acknowledged as an exemplar of innovation and leadership in the New Zealand construction sector, including its selection as a Beacon Project by the Construction Sector Accord.

Te Ara Awataha wins Supreme Award for stormwater infrastructure

Northcote Development's Te Ara Awataha greenway project took out three awards at Thursday's Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) 2023 Asset Management Excellence Awards in Rotorua - Excellence in Water, Best Infrastructure Project over \$5 million and the Asset Management Excellence Supreme Award.

Te Ara Awataha is an example of successful collaboration, involving mana whenua, Auckland Council's Healthy Waters, Eke Panuku Development Auckland, local businesses, community groups, schools, residents and volunteers.

As well as being a space for people to come together and connect, Te Ara Awataha is now also an integral part of Northcote's stormwater network, which proved to be invaluable during the Auckland Anniversary floods.

Progress for Ada Street, Hastings

Ada Street is a proposed new ten home development in Hastings that Kāinga Ora were looking at purchasing from a developer once it was built by them. There are currently two existing houses on the site which are being used by Temporary Accommodation Services (TAS) to house families impacted by Cyclone Gabrielle.

We had reached the stage of a conditional offer that was pending consents, but due to concerns raised and the developer's proposed plan falling outside the District Plan, we have been investigating other solutions for the site. Through careful consideration we have come to the agreement that the best option is for us to purchase the site, and develop the land ourselves with a different design.

We have now progressed to a conditional offer for purchasing the site as is with the two houses, which we can then design new plans for. These plans will take some time to work through as want to take the time to get these right, but they will be at less density and work within the District Plan.

The developer will now withdraw Resource Consent during the week of 26 June 2023, and we are working alongside stakeholders and the developer to share an update with community and media about the change to how the site will be developed in the future.


We will not settle on the site and take over ownership until later this year, and once the homes are no longer needed by TAS for housing families impacted by Cyclone Gabrielle.

Fix your Friend

Our Māngere and Ōtara housing support teams collaborated to organise the latest 'Fix Your Friend' event in Ōtāhuhu on 25 June 2023. With the growing issues surrounding dogs in the communities we serve, this was an opportunity to be proactive in this space and support our customers to be responsible dog owners. We connected with Chained Dog Rehab and Auckland Council to offer our customers free vaccinations, microchipping and registrations on the day. Dogs were also treated to new collars and leads if needed, as well as a bag of dog food kindly sponsored by Origin and Acana.

We had a terrific response with 170 dogs through on the day. Due to limited supplies we had to turn away approximately 100 cars, which really demonstrates the level of demand for this service. Customers saved approximately \$400 across the different services offered on the day and all dogs left happy and healthy.

One of our customers who benefited from the first event held in Māngere in November 2022 now volunteers through Chained Dog and was there helping on the day.

We are working on arranging further events for other areas with high dog populations, for example Manurewa. The event was also covered by NewsHub and screened that same night.


