

## 1. Updates

### Kāinga Ora and Emergency Services Workshop

On 24 July 2023, we held a workshop with Tāmaki Makaurau emergency services senior leaders. Attendees were present from New Zealand Police, Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ) and St John Ambulance, and from across design, planning, standards, compliance, construction and customer facing Kāinga Ora teams.

The workshop was organised to respond to questions from the emergency services sector about Kāinga Ora incorporation of Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) principles, along with emergency service access and circulation needs in residential developments.

There was a particular focus on medium and high density developments which is a prevalent Kāinga Ora typology in Tāmaki Makaurau, and a growing style of development across the region overall.

The workshop was an excellent opportunity for Kāinga Ora to present our policies, guidance and practice on these issues and to capture insights from NZ Police, FENZ and St John. Feedback from attendees indicated that this workshop was a really valuable exercise. There is an intent is to continue this form of engagement on a regular basis to build collective understanding and foster relationships across our sectors.

## New warm and dry homes in Blenheim complete

Ten one-bedroom, full universal design units in Blenheim are almost ready for residents to move in.

Placements are underway for the single-level homes on the corner of Richmond and Charles Streets and customers are expected to move in in mid-August 2023. Some of our current customers, and people from the housing register, will be matched to the homes.

The homes were built by local construction company CMT Group and have taken a year to complete.

We are pleased to be able to offer customers good quality, new homes in a part of Blenheim that is close to town, shops and other services. Four homes were on the site before it was redeveloped.

Our Nelson, Marlborough and West Coast team is planning a blessing of the site in early August (time and date still TBC). We are also planning to invite local media to walk through the site, and to speak to Regional Director, Julia Campbell.

## Winton Land Limited and Sunfield Developments Limited (Winton) amended statement of claim

Winton Land Limited and Sunfield Developments Limited (Winton) have filed an amended statement of claim in their Commerce Act claim against Kāinga Ora.

The amended claim now includes a 'provisionally assessed' amount of \$138.5 million damages that Winton alleges it has lost on the Sunfield development as a result of the alleged conduct of Kāinga Ora. The initial claim left all damages to be quantified by Winton at a later date. There remain other claimed damages that are still unquantified. The amended claim also reflects changes to section 36 of the Commerce Act 1986 that came into force in April 2023.

Winton has notified the NZX of this amendment to its claim.

The amended statement of claim does not introduce any new causes of action and the substance of the claims against Kāinga Ora have not changed. Kāinga Ora has five working days to file its amended statement of defence.

Kāinga Ora will continue to respond to the litigation as an operational matter, and to de y the claims made by Winton. The 'provisionally assessed' damages amount is a large figure, but was expected to be in this order of magnitude. Kāinga Ora continues to put considerable effort into responding to the litigation.

### **Huntington Park East Tāmaki Fire**

Early on 24 July 2023, a fire started at the Guys Road and Cott smore Place development which is currently under construction in East Tāmaki.

This development is set to deliver 48 homes and a common room. Six three-bedroom units were completely destroyed and a number of other units in neighbouring blocks on the site also sustained heat-related damage.

The development is currently owned by Gemscott and will be transferred to Kāinga Ora ownership on completion of the homes, which was originally anticipated for June 2024 delivery. Investigations are underway to confirm the damage to the underlying foundations and drainage of the block, and once this is known the delivery timeline will be updated. It is anticipated there will be staged delivery to provide the developer additional time to complete the six most impacted units.

Police are treating the fire as suspicious and an investigation is underway. Fortunately, no one was injured during this event.

Gemscott has been working with the local community to support them since the fire, including the washing of smoke-damaged properties and repair of fire-damaged fences. Gemscott has also employed security for evenings and weekends, and security cameras have been installed.

### New phase and new name for Auckland Civils Alliance

On Tuesday, 1 August Kāinga Ora Urban Development and Delivery (UDD) agreed to extend the Piritahi Alliance contract for a further five years from December 2023 to December 2028.

General Manager UDD, Mark Fraser says land development on the scale we are undertaking requires significant input and collaboration from a range of agencies, and we know that the alliance model continues to be the most effective way we can deliver land to support more homes in our Auckland LSPs.

In the five years since the alliance was formed, it will have delivered over \$700m of civil and infrastructure works, enabling over 4,500 homes across our Auckland LSPs – an extraordinary amount of work. This contract extension represents a programme of infrastructure and civils delivery that will enable around 6,000 new homes across Auckland.

UDD has undertaken a significant evaluation process over the past few months, and Tuesday's announcement signalled a new phase for the alliance, one that is focused on collaboration cost, programme performance, and quality.

And with this new phase, we are also taking the opportunity to give it a new name: the LEAD Alliance.

LEAD stands for Land Enablement and Delivery, and is a group of companie combining skills and experience to lead the design and construction of infrastructure of New Zealand's largest urban development programme. This includes creating builder-ready land, the construction of new roads, parks and amenities, and of course vital infrastructure to support more resilient neighbourhoods.

The announcement was marked by representatives from Kāinga Ora, EAD Alliance and the five non-owner participants (Hick Bros, Dempsey Wood, Harrison Grierson, Woods and Tonkin + Taylor) coming together at our Northcote LSP (the location of the ve y first alliance package of work) to sign the contract.



# Update to DPMC Implementation Unit Stocktake of our Public Housing Construction Pipeline and Delivery

Kāinga Ora met with the DPMC Implementation Unit last week on 27 July 2023 to verbally update them on progress. We informed them that we were ahead of where we expected to be regarding delivery of homes against our SPE 2.1 target, subsequent to its revision in February 2023 following weather events, and the balance of delayed homes would be delivered by the end of August 2023. We also informed them we were successful in achieving our net increase of homes under measure SPE 2.2. A number of other relevant SPE targets were discussed too.

We also updated them on the good progress being made against the six actions outlined in their report and resulting paper to the Cabinet Priorities Committee in March 2023, including changes to the pipeline buffer, prioritising workforce and human capital needs, opportunities to improve pace, efficiency and quality relative to cost for Kāinga Ora-led projects, identifying target ranges and setting performance measures, building a system to track and report Kāinga Ora projects, and generating insights into why projects are delayed.





- We have made 4 053 outbound welfare calls, and referred 312 customer to other agencies for support.
- There were 28 customers that were evacuated, but none required permanent rehousing.
