




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1. Updates

Takaanini transformation to activity based workspace

On 14 February 2023, work commenced on refurbishing and extending ou Taka nini office. While the work was undertaken, the team took the opportunity to strengthen existing relationships internally and externally by co-locating with our Manukau office and Papakura Mar e

Following completion of the work, a whakawātea was undertaken by Matua David and Matua Tom, and the team returned to the office on 26 April 2023.

The office previously accommodated 26 desks, two interview rooms and a meeting room. The office is now an activity-based workspace, with a total of 38 desks, three interview rooms, a quiet space and a boardroom. It includes specialist teams such as placements, maintenance and assets. The increased space and inclusion of specialist teams in the one building will enable more effective collaboration to assist our customers.

Home ownership roadshow in Te Tai Tokerau

The home ownership products roadshow has continued with an event in Kaeo on 20 April 2023.

The Kaeo roadshow follows the Whangārei roadshow of earlier in the year which targeted Pasifika. The Kaeo event targeted the Māori population of the area, and featured our teams partnering with the Māori Land Court to present to approximately 80 whānau, leading to 12 promising home-ownership enquiries.

Some whānau, who are also house purchasers, were unable to attend. A further roadshow is being scheduled for mid to late June 2023 to enable these whānau to hear about the products.

The community was grateful to Kāinga Ora for the event in their community.

Mangere local stakeholder hui - stormwater, floods and the future

On 27 April 2023, Kāinga Ora and Auckland Council's Healthy Waters team, led a hui about stormwater management in Mangere. The hui was in response to community concerns about the impact of housing intensification following the Auckland Annivers bry Weekend flood, and the lack of information about what is planned to manage flooding, especially a ound Te Ararata Stream. Fourteen key stakeholders attended, including members of the local board and representatives from influential community groups. Staff reiterated the scale of the 27 January flood (in excess of a one-in-200 year event), the work already undertaken to upgrade the Mangere Inlet and plans to develop a flood management strategy for the area. Those who a tended supported our plans to roll out a series of similar, community engagement events.

An additional 'flood information session' arranged by locals who are the Stream Team (known for their restorative efforts of Te Ararata stream), was also held over the weekend. Auckland Councillor Julie Fairey presented on stormwater infrast ucture, and Kāinga Ora staff took part in a constructive Q+A session with approximately 30 locals in attendance.




New names gifted for the complex development at Greys Avenue, Auckland

Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei has gifted new names for the overall complex, and the three separate buildings at 139 Greys Ave. The complex will now be known as Te Mātāwai which means a source of water emerging from the whenua in the upper reaches of a catchment. The three distinct buildings that make up the new complex have been named:

- Waitapu Building A
- Waiora Building B
- Wainui Building C

The explanation for each of these names is wai, whose mauri is intact and which possesses elevated properties, which promote wellbeing (noting that the name Waitapu does not refer to any reference to water that is sacred or forbidden). Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei has also gifted names for some of the communal spaces in the complex and our Hapori Kaitiaki service. We are grateful to Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei for their generosity in gifting these names to Kāinga Ora and for the ongoing pattnership that we have enjoyed on the Te Mātāwai project.

Kawiu Road, Levin

To help meet the future need for more homes for people and families in Levin, Kāinga Ora – Homes and Communities purchased a 4 hectare land parcel at Kawiu Road in September 2022.

The area around Kawiu Road and Ryder Crescent needs to be rezoned from Deferred Residential to Residential, to permit residential development and installation of urban services, such as water infrastructure and better transport connections. In our urban development role, Kāinga Ora is helping lead this coordinated planning effort with Iwi, Horowhenua District Council, landowners and other key stakeholders to enable the delivery of infrastructure and more homes, of all types, in this area. The current focus is on technical investigations, which will help with developing a Structure Plan for the new growth area, North West of Levin.

We are committed to updating the community about development progress, including providing detailed site plans once they are confirmed in the coming months.

Porirua Development Update - Spatial Plan Community Engagement

On Friday 26 May, Kāinga Ora with its Porirua Development partners, Ngāti Toa and Porirua City Council, will launch community engagement for the Porirua Spat al p an wit Hui tahi tātou o Porirua - Eastern Porirua Community Engagement Exhibition. The purpose of the exhibition is to help share and consult with the community on the Porirua Development Spatial Plan. This is a significant document which will guide deliverables for the lifespan of the development, ensuring the best possible outcomes are achieved for existing and future residents, iwi and the environment.

In 2019, Porirua Development engaged closely with the community to understand their priorities and concerns for eastern Porirua, and this feedback has shaped the direction of the spatial plan. Through this process we identified five key moves and see in focus areas that Porirua Development must deliver on in order to have the biggest positive impact. The exhibition is an opportunity to ask the community whether the key moves and focus areas are the right ones, are progressing in the right direction, and if there's anything that has been overlooked.

Hui tahi tātou o Porirua - Eastern Porirua Community Engagement Exhibition will launch with an event for key stakeholders on Friday 26 May continuing for two weeks until 10 June.

Auckland LSP infrastructure partnership cross-organisational launch

Team members from Auckland Transport, Watercare, Healthy Waters, Auckland Council's Customer and Community Services, its development office, finance, planning and regulation units and Kāinga Ora – Homes and Communities on 1 May attended a launch event for the collaborative programme to together plan, invest and deliver infrastructure for the Auckland LSPs.

During the 1 May session, staff heard from the organisation's leaders on their vision for the partnership, and the work already underway which includes:

- Establishing common understanding of the infrastructure programme of work required to deliver to communities established within the LSPs and support housing growth
- Identifying the opportunities to leverage the \$1.9b Housing Acceleration Fund investment from the Crown to sustainably fund the future programme of works
- Identifying opportunities to streamline how we work removing inefficiencies so we can manage an increasing pipeline of work.

It was also the opportunity for teams to meet with Auckland Council Group and Kāinga Ora colleagues who are integral in delivering the LSP infrastructure programme and leading he way forward together within their respective organisations. Representatives from the Depa tment of Internal Affairs and Three Waters Entity A also attended.

The event follows from last month's highly successful tour of Auckland infrastructure projects by Mayor Wayne Brown and Chief Executives of Auckland Council Grup, Auckland Transport, Watercare, Eke Panuku, Kāinga Ora and the Infrastructu e Commission.

Cannons Creek Park Wetland - Community Design

Starting in May 2023, Kāinga Ora (with partners Ngati Toa and Porirua City Council) will begin a series of community design workshops for the Cannons Creek Park Wetland project within the Porirua Large Scale Project. The key outcomes from these workshops will be to; forge relationships with the community and build community pride and ownership of Cannons Creek park. The project aspires to integrate engineering function and fit for purpose outdoor recreational areas that provide health and wellbeing benefits to the community.

The wetland project will support the delivery of housing in eastern Porirua by providing stormwater treatment and collection to the Cannons Creek north east and south east neighborhoods. As a key element of the overall master-planning for the Porirua LSP, the wetland project will also include wider upgrades to Cannons Creek Park, a key community asset for the eastern Porirua community. Kāinga Ora is working with Porirua City Council to align investment in the park into a single delivery project to provide cohesive response to the opportunities and challenges of the built environment

Point Chevalier module installation underway this month

Installation of offsite manufactured modules commences next week at the Kāinga Ora apartment development on Great North Road in Point Chevalier, Auckland.

Build partner Tawera Group is completing the scaffolding and crane erection works and the first modules are due to arrive on site on 8 May 2023.

The Great North Road development will deliver 63 one-bedroom apartment units over six levels. The scheme has been conceived as an OSM pilot using fully fitted modular units manufactured in China and assembled on site in New Zealand. Subject to weather conditions, four-six modules can be lifted into position each day and the process is expected to take three-four months. Once the modules are installed, work on the façade and finishes will begin.

This next phase of construction will be highly visible to the community and a communications plan has been developed to be keep stakeholders informed. Key messages will include our plans for the exterior of the building. We anticipate there may be commentary on the initial look of the modules, which is an interim perspective until façade work begins.

The façade will differ from the current approved package – enhancements are being made to the exterior as well as the landscaping treatment and communal am niti s. A r source consent amendment is underway for this and final designs will be shared as soon as consent is received.

Our communications plan will also include details of the continued acknowledgement of John. A. Lee and his commemorative sign. This was removed from the original pensioner dwellings on site and is currently in storage. It will be reinstated on the new building and will be part of opening celebrations when the development is complete in 2024.



7. Impacts of weather events

Auckland/Northland region

- There are now 662 properties across the Auckland region affected.
- 656 inspections have been completed and six not applicable due to pending redevelopmen pla s
- Linked to the 662 impacted properties, 298 customers will be required to either move or receive an offer to move.
 - o To date, **155** customers have started new tenancies

Central region

- 359 homes in the region have been assessed as having damage from the cyclone with the majority 341 considered minor damage.
- We are aware of:
 - o Wairoa
 - two white placards
 - one yellow placard
 - Hawke's Bay
 - seven white placards
- We have made 4,053 outbound welfare calls, and referred 312 customer to other agencies for support.
- There were 28 customers that were evacuated, but none r quired permanent rehousing.
