




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1. Updates

Hobsonville Point terraced homes win top architectural design award

The Te Uru Terraces jointly took out the Supreme Award at the 2023 National Resene Architectural Design Awards. The walk-up terraced homes, within the Kāinga Ora Hobsonville P int development, were the result of a partnership between Fletcher Living and Ngāti Whātua o K ipara and designed by Construkt Architects. The judges noted the unique design of the terraces as an enample of "density done well".

While outwardly appearing as a traditional three-storey terrace, the firs floo of the buildings contains a one-bedroom unit, with the upper two levels containing a spacious bree-bedroom home. The provision of the one-bedroom units helped to meet the affordability target required by Kāinga Ora in Hobsonville Point. Kāinga Ora Urban Design Team Leade, O son Waldock, convener of the Hobsonville Point Urban Design Review Panel, said: "This typology gives us the ability to deliver a larger number of smaller, more affordable and more accessible ground floor units at Hobsonville Point."

Plans for the redevelopment of significant Dunedin site progressing

Dunedin continues to be a priority area for Kāinga Ora based on current demand, with over 400 people on the Ministry of Development's housing register in the city as at September 2023.

We are particularly focussed on delivering new homes in reas of the city that are well connected to amenities, open green spaces and services.

To boost the supply of public housing in the city, we are redeveloping our property at 118 Carroll Street, Central Dunedin, to make better use of the site. The redevelopment will see 16 existing houses, that were no longer fit for purpose, replaced with up to 40 new, warm and dry homes for whānau in need of a place to call home.

A resource consent application is currently being assessed by Dunedin City Council through a limited notification process and we have ecently shared an overview of the proposed new homes with the community.

The proposed plans include a ound 25 percent of the homes meeting full universal design standards, meaning they can be adapted to be accessible for people of all abilities, at any stage of life. They also include a shared outdoor space and a community room facility. Carparking for residents has also been incorporated into the design.

We are tooking forward to construction starting next year and delivering these new, ideally located homes to te Dunedin community, so more people can live in an established area that is close to shops, open paces and other amenities.





Two new homes for Westport

Residents are set to move into two new warm and dry Kāinga Ora homes that have replaced one flood-damaged house in Westport before Christmas.

The two-bedroom homes on the corner of Riley Place and Rintoul Street were blessed by local iwi Ngāti Waewae at the end of November 2023. The Nelson, Marlborough and West Coast team also invited local stakeholders on a walk-through of the homes after the blessing.

The homes, which are raised to meet flood plan requirements, were built off-site at Rolleston Prison, near Christchurch, under a partnership between Kāinga Ora and the Department of Corrections.

After excavation and foundation work was completed, the two homes were transported to Westport in August 2024, before being lifted on to the piles and connected to key services. Other work such as landscaping and the construction of concrete driveways and paths, a timber deck and stairs was also undertaken.

As at September 2023, there were 180 applicants on the Ministry of Social Development housing register across the West Coast (Buller, Grey and Westland districts).

Many of our West Coast homes are ageing. We are looking to replace some of our older homes on large sections with a greater number of modern homes, as we have done at Rintoul Street.

Collaboration with community agencies for social outcomes

A number of initiatives are underway, or in development, across Auckland and Northland operating regions to support vulnerable communities and at-risk households.

The Auckland Flood Recovery team has partnered with New Zealand Red Cross to provide home package essentials for those customers who lost personal possessions earlier this year due to Auckland weather events. The packages include essential furniture and household items for bathroom, kitchen, dining, living and bedroom areas. Packages are prioritised for customers who have no other means of replacing or sourcing these items.

We are partnering with Water Safety New Zealand to emphasise water safety education and drowning prevention. We are utilising our various customer and staff communication channels to highlight the importance of water safety over the summer months. That includes water safety at our properties in relation to the use of pop-up backyard pools in hot weather.

Other work is in development with the Stroke Foundation New Zealand. We are working together to plan a pilot in 2024 to educate our communities on stroke prevention. This pilot will be focused on our Māori and Pasifika families who are at higher risk of being impacted by stroke


