<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> CHP Lease Portfolio properties are those owned by Kāinga Ora but leased to and operated by Community Housing Providers (CHPs). Reporting on these properties is undertaken by the CHP to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development and so are separated from Kāinga Ora State Rentals to avoid double counting. On 3 October 2020 in line with its operating principles and commitment to support Māori Housing initiatives, Kāinga Ora leased 902 properties to Te Āhuru Mōwai (established by Ngāti Toa) as part of the Western Porirua Housing Partnership Project.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> Transitional Housing provides temporary accommodation and social services for people with an immediate housing need while support is put in place to transition them into sustainable public or private housing on a long-term basis.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>4</sup> A bedsit does not have a separate bedroom.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>5</sup> Non-Public Housing provides homes specifically for rent through the private market at our Te Mātawai complex (139 Greys Avenue, Auckland). This was approved by the then Cabinet as a pilot only for this complex to help create a more diverse and mixed community, with a greater sense of inclusion and neighbourliness.
