#### Kāinga Ora Appropriation Change processes – IAF and KiwiBuild

- Kāinga Ora has been provided specific funding through the Homes and Communities appropriation to help address several key issues that have reduced the ability of the New Zealand housing and urban development sector to meet the changing needs of New Zealanders.
- This appropriation funding currently ends on 30 June 2024. A business case for future funding post June 2024 for the Infrastructure Acceleration Fund (IAF) and Commercial Products (KiwiBuild) teams was considered by Government.
- The Government has confirmed its expectations in relation to IAF and KiwiBuild, and in the Budget announcement selected the minimal services option. This means the work we are required to do for IAF and KiwiBuild will change and therefore it is proposed that the resourcing in the respective teams also needs to change.
- We commenced a change consultation process with the relevant teams on Thursday 13 June.
- For IAF, the total number of roles proposed to be disestablished is four. Of these, one is vacant and two filled by temporary resource. One permanent employ e may be made redundant if redeployment is unsuccessful.
- For KiwiBuild, the total number of roles proposed to be directablished is seven. Of these, two are vacant. Five permanent employees may be made redundant if redeployment is unsuccessful.

#### Kāinga Ora renewable energy team change proposal

- The Kāinga Ora renewable energy programme has been funded to date by the Māori and Public Housing Renewable Energy fund. This funding will cease on 30 June 2024 and additional funding to continue the work has not been secured.
- Wh st the funding will cease on 30 June 2024, there is still a requirement for temporary resourcing to ensure final projects are commissioned and effective, to transition to a business as usual approach, and to manage the Multiple Trading Trial.
- To reflect these changes, we propose to commence a change consultation process with the Renewable Energy team on 24 June 2024.
- The total number of roles this change proposal will impact is five. Three fixed term employment arrangements will end as at 30 June 2024. Two permanent employees are proposed to continue in transitional roles and may exit on the grounds of redundancy at the end of the transitional period, if redeployment is unsuccessful.

## Industry recognition for social housing developments at the Property Council New Zealand, Property Industry Awards.

- Hosted by the Property Council of New Zealand, five Kāinga Ora social housing developments received industry awards at the recent 2024 Property Industry Awards held on 14 June 2024.
- A complex at Riccarton Road, Christchurch, won the overall award in the social and affordable housing category, while developments in Lower Hutt, Māngere and Central Auckland all achieved Excellence, and a development in Whangārei received a Merit. Details as follows:

#### Best Social and Affordable Housing: Riccarton Road, Christchurch

- Built on 1751m2 land, twenty new homes replaced four old state homes.
- The building includes a system that shares electricity generated by solar panels equally amongst residents.

#### Excellence Social and Affordable Housing: Oxford Terrace, Lower Hutt W Ilington

- This development replaced an earthquake vulnerable sixteen-uni blo k with thirty-two new homes.
- Built on 2,725m2 land located to public amenities, the development also included an upgrade of public land on the Oxford Terrace and Mitchel Street corner of the site.

#### Excellence Social and Affordable Housing: Te Mātāwai, Central Auckland

- Built on 6374m2 to provide homes to some of Auck and's most vulnerable, this complex has 24/7 on site support for social housing residents.
- Three buildings with 276 apartments replaced and an old 87-unit state housing building.

#### Excellence Social and Affordable Housing: Bader Ventura, Mangere, Auckland

- This development replaced three old state homes on 2,819m2 of land with eighteen new homes.
- This project was the first government funded Passive House public housing development in Australasia.

#### Merit Social and Affordable Housing: Puriri Park Road, Whangārei

- This social housing development delivered thirty-seven new homes on land previously owned by the Ministry of Education.
- Half of P riri Park Road's 1.7ha land is a native bush reserve, which Kāinga Ora has gifted to Whangārei District Council, is now accessible through the installation of a new loop road.

Community viewing day for Community Lane and Great North Road, Avondale (Highbury Triangle)

- From 17 June 2024, customers ill begin moving into Auckland's largest and newest social housing development - Community Lane and Great North Road, formerly known as Highbury Triangle.
- With four out of five buildings now open to customers, once complete there will be a total of 236 homes spread over five buildings. As part of the community engagement approach, Kāinga Q a committed to open the homes for the community to view through a guided tour prior to customers moving.
- The tour was held from 12.00pm to 3.00pm on 14 June 2024. Approximately 300 people attended, comprised of:
  - ∘ s 9(2)(a)
  - A large number of community organisations including representatives from: Kahui Tu Kaha (transitional housing staff from St Georges Road accommodation), I Love Avondale, Whau Local Board, Ward Councillor, Auckland Council staff, architects and designers and other interested folks who have watched the development throughout
  - Eke Panuku attended in support to enable community members to understand the Avondale township redevelopment planning
  - Age Concern attended in support of 'International Elder Abuse Awareness Day' (15 June 2024 and across the week), and to speak with individuals and whanau about their service offerings.
- General feedback was positive about homes with universal design and accessibility features as well as indoor/outdoor areas to help residents connect with each other.

- The delivery of the homes and occupation is staggered from 20 June 2024 through to approximately end November / early December 2024 (last building estimated completion).
- Moves need to be carefully coordinated into the buildings due to lift access (2 per building), and when accessing the site to ensure the safety of movers and customers as there continues to be construction happening across the site.

#### Auckland CBD Safety

- On 14 June 2024, Kāinga Ora attended a meeting called by the Minister of Police, Hon Mark Mitchell on safety in Auckland's CBD.
- Attendees included as well as the Minister, Mayor Brown, local MP Chlöe Swarbrick, community groups, resident associations, business groups, NGOs and government agencies (Police, MSD, HUD and Kāinga Ora). There were approximately 30 attendees.
- The Minister's agenda covered rough sleepers, emergency and social housing, youth crime, retail crime, and drug and alcohol use. However, due to time constraints the meeting was only able to discuss <u>homelessness and emergency and social housing</u>.
- Main points of the discussion:
  - The Minister said it was important to address city centre safety to ensure the ongoing vibrancy of the area. The Minister was looking for a joined-up strategy.
  - The Mayor wants a stronger police presence, and would prefer more uniformed patrols over a central police station. The Mayor wanted the social and housing agencies to think carefully about the types and volumes of people placed in social housing in the city centre.
  - Local MP Chlöe Swarbrick suggested following the Christchu ch Gap Filler project, which is a place shaping initiative that temporarily repurposes vacant sites with the aim of maintaining urban vibrancy. The Minister signalled his interest in the initiative.
  - Police Commissioner, Andrew Coster advised the t Police are increasing their physical presence, with more foot patrols. Police have a small base on Federal Street with approximately 30 staff. The Police recognise the value of a physical presence, but do not have the funds to establish a police station in the central city.
  - MSD reported it has reduced emergency housing in the city centre by 65 per cent compared to the previous year. MSD uses six sites in the city centre and plans to reduce those to a lower number.
  - Kāinga Ora reported that its inner city portfolio has been about the same size for the last 15 to 20 years and its Te Mātāwai development on Greys Avenue has 24/7 on-site management with wrap around support provided for residents with improved access to healthcare services. Kāinga Ora stressed that they are only looking at renewing their central city port olio not expanding it.
  - Lifewise thought he number of rough sleepers had not increased. Several stakeholders noted that issues are being driven by different groups, and that it would be wrong to consider it was a homogenous group helped with simple interventions. They cited rough leep rs, drug dealers, drug or alcohol users, and beggars as being different cohorts wit different needs.

The local business associations noted the impact city centre safety and prolonged CRL onstruction was having on business owners and workers. They were looking for a joined-up approach that involved enforcement by Police and Auckland Council, and social and health wrap-around services from government agencies and NGOs.


